

Ridgeway School Pupil Premium Impact 2016/17

The information below is subject to further updates following the release of validated data from the DfE Performance Tables (due for release 25th January 2018)

The impact summary has been used to inform the School Improvement Plan and specifically Pupil Premium strategy to further narrow the gap between disadvantaged students and wider school population

Pupil Premium cohort

20% of the 2016/17 cohort were pupil premium eligible pupils

Attainment

75% of students achieved 9-4 grade in both English & maths;

44% of pupil premium students achieved A*-C in English and maths.

The average Attainment 8 Score for all students was 52.18. Pupil premium students was 40.05

The measure of progress made from KS2 – GCSE known as Progress 8 (zero is the National Average for all students) was +0.26 for all students at Ridgeway. The Pupil Premium students achieved -0.13. This means the gap in progress made between disadvantaged students and the wider school population was -0.39. Whilst this is an improvement on the 2015/16 P8 gap (-0.58) and as shown in the table below evidence that the progress of this years Pupil Premium cohort (-0.13) was significant improvement on the previous cohort (-0.85), there is a great deal to do to further narrow the gap in attainment and progress.

Attendance

The Ridgeway School and Sixths Form's attendance in 2016-17 of 95.2% was an improvement on the 2015-16 figure of 94.3%. The gap between pupil premium students and all other students for the percentage of sessions missed due to overall absence was -3.1%.

The gap between pupil premium students and all other students for persistence absence was -11.3%.(22.5% compared to 25% 2015/16)

Behaviour and Safety

Fixed term and permanent exclusions across school were well below national average.

Leavers' Destinations 2016 and 2017

96% of students were in sustained education and employment- well above national average.
